SEVERAL YEARS AGO [WRITTEN IN 1920], THE SOCIETY FOR PREVENTION OF CRUELTY TO CHILDREN STOPPED PLACING CHILDREN IN THIS HOME. IT RECENTLY HAD 25 CHILDREN IN RESIDENCE, AGE 2 MOS.-17 YEARS, WITH POOR SANITARY CONDITIONS AND INADEQUATE NUTRITION [LEADING TO RICKETS DISEASE]. "NO ADEQUATE OR ACCURATE RECORDS WERE KEPT OF THE CHILDREN ADMITTED." THE ASSISTANT SUPERINTENDENT WAS CONVICTED OF BRUTALITY AND THE SUPERINTENDENT WAS SENTENCED TO JAIL.
